
Dali Datong



The trail towards Dali begins next to the public restrooms at the Taroko Terrace Bus Parking Lot. It overlaps Dekalun Trail and then ascends via steps. A one-way hike to Dali takes about three hours, and then two and a half hours from Dali Village to Datong Village. The trail features information signboards along the way.

Dali Village, formerly known as Xoxos, is above the left bank of Shakadang River, located on a 915-meter-high terrace.

Datong Village, formerly named Shakadang, is located on a 1128-meter-high terrace above the left bank, near the middle section of Shakadang River. These two villages were relocated in 1980 to the Minle Community in Xiulin Township's Fushi Village. They were the last villages in Taroko National Park to be moved from the mountains.

Traffic Information

Bike

The trail is not accessible for bikes. Cyclists are recommended to lock up bikes at the bike racks in the Taroko Terrace Parking Lot at Taroko National Park

Bus

- 1. From Hualien station, take Hualien Bus 1129 bound for Taroko, Ubus 310, or Hualien Bus 1133 bound for Tianxiang, Luoshao-1126, or Lishan-1141, and alight at Taroko National Park Headquarters.
- 2. From Xincheng station take TaiwanTrip Ubus 310, Taroko Bus 302 or take a Hualien Bus 1133 bound for Tianxiang and alight at Taroko National Park Headquarters visitor center.

Driving

Take Provincial Highway 8 or Provincial Highway 9 to Taroko Terrace. The trailhead is next to the public restrooms near the west bus parking lot. Enter from Dekalun Trail, which connects to the Dali-Datong Trail at its highest point.

Parking

The parking lot at the Taroko National Park Visitor Center can accommodate small and large cars, tour buses. Disabled parking spaces are available for those with valid permits.
